- o° turn radius
- Mountain bike wheels
- Easy to push levers
- Optional handles for assistance
- Foot plate
- Parks with GRIT chairs:
 - Cedar Hill
 - Dinosaur Valley
 - Ray Roberts Lake Isle du Bois
 - Purtis Creek
 - 18 additional parks

Tandem Hiking Carts

- Rider must be 50% or less body weight of "driver"
 - Ex: If rider is 50 lbs driver must weight at least 100 lbs
- Sherpa frame and harness
- Adjustable trekking poles
- Large wheel to navigate terrain
- Adjustable 4-point harness
- Available at:
 - Cedar Hill SP
 - Dinosaur Valley SP
 - McKinney Falls SP
 - Brazos Bend SP




Stay a while!

- Site specific reservations choose your own site (photos, accessible, remote, etc)
- Search availability by accessible features, locations, activity, etc
- Call Center Agents assist you with your needs
- Ways to stay

Reserve one of these chairs ahead of time by emailing the park or calling the park at (254) 897-4588. You can also borrow on the day of your visit, if available.



Trails

Some portions of the Paluxy River Trail are paved. A 0.25-mile paved trail connects the Main Track Site Parking Lot to the Lanham Mills Campground, where the trail continues on the paved roadway for another 0.25 miles. Other areas of the trail are rougher and unpaved, but the GRIT chair can traverse it.







Reserve a Site

- Filter by "accessible features"
- Book early!
 - 5 months out for popular parks
- Double check site features
 - many are "close" to accessible
 - Call park if in doubt
- Contact Reservation Center




